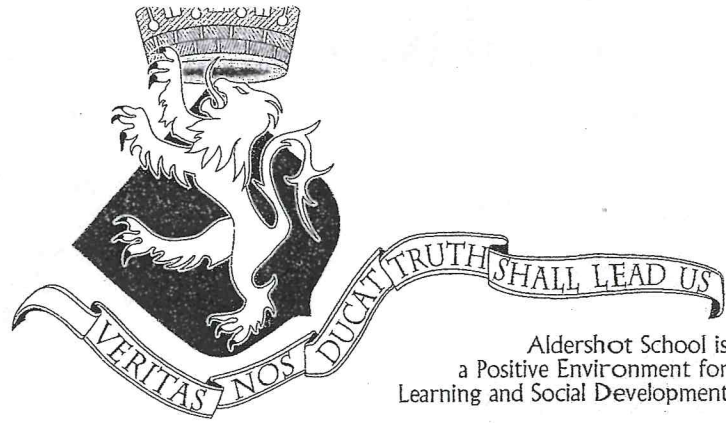

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are pleased to inform you that our intermediate physical education classes will be taking advantage of our close proximity to the Aldershot Pool. On Feb. 13, 14, 15 and Mar. 5, 6, 7 our physical education classes will take place at the pool. Students will be asked to complete a swim test initially (in the shallow end) if they are beginners and will then proceed to take part in a swimming class. The class will begin with a warm-up followed by some swimming/fitness games and some recreational swim time. The cost for this program will be \$10.00 (cash or cashless please) to cover the pool rental and lifeguard supervision. There will be two lifeguards on duty and two physical education teachers during each period. In order for us to cover costs at this fee we are hoping for full participation. Any student not comfortable swimming in the deep end will NOT be required to at any time during the class. Students will be marked during these sessions on participation (not skills). Please return your payment and the permission slip attached to your son/daughter's physical education teacher ASAP. 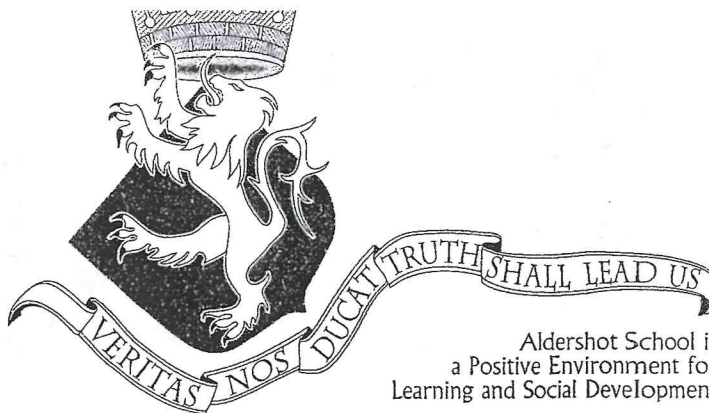

Dear Parent/Guardian:

As part of the grade 7/8 physical education program we are planning a trip to Mount St. Louis -Moonstone for a day of ski or snowboard instruction on **Friday February 17, 2012**. Students will have the option to choose either of these programs. Each program includes a one hour lesson (beginner lessons are scheduled at the beginning of the day) followed by an ability test which restricts students to areas of the resort that match their ability level. **As per Halton District School Board Policy and Mount St. Louis -Moonstone Resort policy a lesson is mandatory for all students regardless of ability; however students are grouped based upon experience.** In addition, Mount St. Louis-Moonstone and the Halton District School Board has adopted a **mandatory policy of helmet use for all skiers and snow boarders and leashes** for all snowboards. Helmets are available for rental. Further, students will no longer be permitted in the terrain park or super pipe, anyone found in the park will forfeit their right to ski/board for the remainder of the day and will sit in the chalet with a supervisor.

Please read over and counsel your son/daughter on the importance of the attached **Alpine Responsibility Code**. Ensure that your son/daughter indicated their ability based upon their experience. Remember that a student may be an advanced skier but if they are trying snowboarding for the first time they should indicate "beginner".

The buses will **depart from Aldershot at 6:30 a.m.** to allow us to arrive at Mount St. Louis for an early start. We will depart from the resort at 2:30 p.m., which should see us arriving **back at Aldershot by approximately 4:00 p.m.** We will be travelling by coach bus. Please make arrangements to pick up your son/daughter at this time.

Please counsel your son/daughter about the **importance of appropriate dress**. All students should have a warm jacket, waterproof (warm) pants, hat, gloves/mitts (an extra pair is a good idea). Wrist guards are also highly recommended for snowboarders.

Below is an outline of the costs for each program. Students **select one program and return the permission slip with cash or pay online through the cashless system**. If you have any further questions please feel free to contact either of us at Aldershot (637-2383). We are also looking for parent volunteers to join us. The ski resort recommends teachers and supervisors ski with the students so they provide free passes and equipment rentals. Please let us know (on the permission slip) if you would be interested in joining us. Please note that only parents with a current criminal record check are able to supervise. We encourage all students to take advantage of this wonderful opportunity for a day of outdoor education; however, there will be an alternate program at the school provided to any student that does not choose to attend.

**SKIER'S RESPONSIBILITY CODE**

There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

1. Always stay in control. You must be able to avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
5. If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the ski patrol.
6. Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
7. Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
8. Keep off closed trails and areas.
9. You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through the use of alcohol or drugs.
10. You must have sufficient physical dexterity , ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
